Bring & Share Lunch

It has been a while since we had a Bring & Share Lunch so I thought I would write about how it works.

These lunches are held on the 1st Sunday of each month after the morning service.

What is a Bring & Share Lunch? A time of fellowship with each other and share food together.

Why do we have it? It is an opportunity to chat and get to know people in an informal setting.

What do I need to bring? You can bring any food, hot or cold. If you decide to bring a hot dish please bring it already cooked. If you can bring it in a container that will keep it hot like a slow cooker or a casserole that can be popped in the oven to keep warm that would be ideal. Please note ALL food MUST have an ingredients list.

Do I have to bring hot food? No, cold food is also fine to bring.

Do I have to bring home cooked food? No, it can be shop bought but must be cooked at home first if bringing a hot dish.

Do I have to bring enough food for everyone? No, just enough food for your family or yourself.

Do I need to book? No booking required, just come along How long will it last? There is no set time and you are free to leave when you need to but most probably 1.5/2 hours

I hope this answers some questions you may have but please speak with me if you are still unsure about anything. The emphasis on these lunches if fellowship together.

As with most things volunteers are needed to help with the smooth running of these events and to prevent all the work falling on just a few people. As the lunches are only once a month then the more helpers we have the less time you will be required to help. 

PAT Testing (Portable Appliance Testing)

We will soon be testing all electrical equipment used in the church or Next Door for safety.

If you use any electrical equipment that I will not easily find, please send me a list with location of this equipment. Please also include any electrical items you bring in and connect to a church or Next Door power socket. This includes extension leads, uplighters, amplifiers and other devices. We can then arrange a suitable time to test these.

Users of any electrical equipment used within the church or Next Door should visually inspect the equipment for signs of damage regularly. Do not use the equipment if any damage is found. This should include the plug, power cord and other parts of the equipment.

• Posada

The idea of a Posada comes originally from Central America, probably from Mexico and may go back to the late 16th century. The word 'posada' means 'inn' or 'shelter' in Spanish.

The idea is to use the time of Advent when we prepare for Christ's coming at Christmas, to welcome Mary and Joseph into our homes and remember the time they were trying to find a place for Jesus to be born in Bethlehem.

There is a Posada set (basically a manger scene) which travels around the congregation, moving to a new home each day. Members of the congregation sign up for a day when they can receive the Posada which will be brought to them by the household that precedes them on the list. They will welcome the visitors, provide simple refreshments (tea/ coffee + biscuits/cake) and then hold a short act of welcome. (Words provided). The journey for the holy family will finish in the Church on Christmas morning.

• EDI Training - reminder

The Methodist Church is committed to justice, dignity and solidarity. A new online Methodist training programme on equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI) is now available and open to all. The 2021 Methodist Conference agreed that this *EDI training would be mandatory for those holding certain key roles in the church, including ministers, local preachers, safeguarding officers, circuit stewards, church stewards and pioneers.* Those expected to complete the training are required to do this before December 31st 2023.
