• General Church Meeting held on 13th March

Our thanks to all who were able to stay for our meeting, and our thanks to the children who waited so patiently until the end.

We thank those who were appointed as church stewards and as representatives to church council.

Marriage & Relationships

An update from our minister Peter Goodhall given at the General Church Meeting:

Our church council meeting on 20th January 2022 decided that we were not in a position to make a final binding vote on the resolutions before us.

An indicative vote on the 2 questions showed a majority against changes in the current position.

We can take time to step back and reflect and pray further into this to hear what God is saying to us as a church, including listening to our wider church family, realising there is no time-pressure for us to make a final decision.

We invited responses to myself or a church steward or a member of our church council.

I personally have had several responses - both conversations and written responses, and others here have had conversations also. Some have been strongly in favour and some have been strongly against. To some extent, this reflects our church council who represent the church at the church council meeting.

This indicative vote has left some disappointed, some reassured and others still uncertain.

This has been done with humility & grace – for which we can be grateful.

We live with contradictory convictions, which is just where the 2021 Methodist Conference has placed us and has placed every church. 2 different avenues of understanding, to walk along with each other side by side, not trying to change one another's views, not the loudest voice wins, but journeying together, our views in tension, loving one another despite our differences.

One commonly repeated phrase to me is

"Peter I would not want to be in your shoes" or

"Rather you than me"

Why do people say this to me?

I am going to speak personally here:

As Shepherd of God's people in this place I am pastorally responsible for everyone, I hold all your views and pray for all of you, wanting us all to be led into God's truth.

(There are different understandings on what that means)

Wanting to lose no one. Wanting to keep the unity of the spirit. Not wanting this church to be the church of one issue.

But pleasing God is my priority, knowing and doing God's will, and I trust it is yours also.

As leader and minister I bear the weight of responsibility when the church brings in new doctrines to weigh and test.

Hebrews 13:17 says

'Those who keep watch over you must give an account'.

There is a lot at stake.

That's why the weight upon my shoulders has been and remains great.

I have had sleepless nights over this question.

What next?

We have options.

We could take a binding vote on these decisions at our next church council, or at a church council meeting later in the year, and we might ask will the outcome be any different from January's indicative vote?

Or we can make a deliberate choice not to take a binding vote.

That doesn't have to be seen as a weakness or an opt-out but what is right for us right now as a church.

This latter path would seem to be the way forward to me.

The meeting intimated their agreement with Peter.

• Could you become a Pastoral Friend?

At Haverhill Methodist Church we seek to support one another through a network of Pastoral Friends.

A Pastoral Friend supports an agreed number of individuals. We are in need of new Pastoral Friends to support an increasing congregation.

The Role of Pastoral Friend at Haverhill Methodist Church:

1. To offer friendship, caring support and encouragement particularly in times of special need.

2. To keep in contact with those you are a pastoral friend to. This contact may happen through Sunday worship, home visits, telephone conversations, email or text or letters/cards.

3. To pray for and perhaps with those you are a pastoral friend to.

4. To make available our Connect newsletter to those unable to access it.

5. To distribute the annual Methodist Church Membership Tickets and Adherent Tickets.

6. As appropriate, to inform the Pastoral Secretary and Church Minister of any serious illness, hospitalisation or if back up support is needed.

7. To inform the Pastoral Secretary of any changes in their contact details.

8. To attend the Pastoral Meeting.

• Vacancy for Safeguarding Officer

We take safeguarding seriously and we need to fill this appointment as soon as possible.
