Wellbeing & Care for others

If you have Covid symptoms or are feeling unwell on any Sunday, please stay at home and do not enter the church premises.

You may consider taking a lateral flow test before coming to church.

Track and Trace

It is still important for us to know who is attending each and every Sunday service. Everyone who enters the church building will either scan the QR code on their mobile phone and/or have their name and contact phone number recorded on paper.

This includes Sunday Club, who separately record names of those attending.

If a positive case of Covid arises, those who have come into contact with the positive case would be informed so they can arrange a lateral flow test. The church premises would be promptly and carefully cleansed should this occur.

It is still a requirement that people correctly self-isolate if they are instructed to do so by the app. If you are 'pinged', please do not attend church, stay home and follow the self-isolation advice.

Hand Sanitizer

We encourage you to keep on using Hand Sanitizer when you enter the church premises.

Good Ventilation

Some windows will be open in the church and the church hall.

Toilets

All toilets on the church premises are now available to use.

Please maintain good hygiene and careful hand washing.

Corridors

Please help keep the church corridors and the foyer clear.

Church Seating

The existing seating layout in church will remain. 90 seats are set out. With the end to the '1-metre plus' requirement, our system of booking seats has now ended. You will choose where to sit.

When sitting with others, it may be helpful to first ask

'Please may I sit here?'

If you wish to keep a chair's distance between yourself and another worshipper, you may wish to place a bag on the chair next to you.

Face Coverings

No longer compulsory, the decision to wear a face covering or not is now down to individual choice. The government recommends that face coverings be worn in crowded areas.

We encourage the wearing of face coverings and will respect individual choice.

Please use caution and place others before yourselves.

If you are clinically vulnerable or have a weak immune system, we strongly advise that you continue to wear a face covering, or if you find yourself sitting close to someone you know is vulnerable, we also ask that you consider wearing a face covering.

Singing – With face coverings

Singing is permitted and carries a risk of spreading Covid particles.

If you wish to sing in church you must please wear a face covering while singing and remove it afterwards if you wish to do so.

Refreshments after the service

The plan is to resume refreshments in the hall on Sunday September 5th. Our next church meal will be the Harvest Lunch on Sunday 3rd October.

Fellowship after Sunday worship continues outside.

Drivers, please be extra careful around people when leaving the car park.

Worship At Home Printed Sheet

16 months on, the current script of our Sunday service will no longer be produced. It will be replaced by material for Sunday Worship provided and downloadable from the Methodist Church Website.

Video Recording of Services

Services will continue to be recorded and put on the church website and our YouTube channel.

Crèche

There is space for 1 family in our un-staffed crèche each Sunday. An informal arrangement of taking turns each week will replace booking. Toys or books will continue to be brought from home. Babies, infants and their parents are always welcome to join the congregation.

Communion Services

Holy Communion will be included in morning worship approximately every six weeks.

Children and families

All age services will continue to be held in church on the first Sunday of each month. From Sunday 12th September, children will

once again meet in church for the first part of the service before going out to Sunday Club.

- Funeral Service

The funeral service for Mr. Frank Martindale, husband of the late Joan Martindale, will take place in our church on Friday 13th August at 1pm.

The funeral service is being deliberately delayed to enable family from Jamaica to attend.

We remember the Martindale family in our prayers. Frank and Joan were known to a number of our own church family.

- Sponsored Ride & Stride – Saturday 11th September 2021

Suffolk Churches Ride and Stride sponsored bike ride/walk/scooter ride/horse ride takes place on Saturday 11 September 2021. Suffolk originated the idea of a Ride in 1982 and since then most of the country has taken up the fund raising idea.. Over 650 churches in Suffolk will be open and it is hoped to improve on the £180,000 raised last year.

Suffolk Historic Churches Trust is a non-denominational Trust helping preserve the county's historic churches and chapels and our chapel at Weston Colville has benefitted in the past.

Sponsorship income is shared equally between the Trust and the rider's nominated church.
