Gospel reading 1 Peter 2:1-10

So abandon every form of evil, deceit, hypocrisy, feelings of jealousy and slander. In the same way that nursing infants cry for milk, you must intensely crave the pure spiritual milk *of God's Word*. For this "milk" will cause you to grow into maturity, fully nourished and strong for life – especially now that you have had a taste of the goodness of the Lord Jehovah and have experienced his kindness.

So keep coming to him who is the Living Stone – though he was rejected and discarded by men but chosen by God and is priceless in God's sight. Come and be his "living stones" who are continually being assembled into a sanctuary for God. For now you *serve* as holy priests, offering up spiritual sacrifices that he readily accepts through Jesus Christ. For it says in Scripture:

Look! I lay a cornerstone in Zion,

a chosen and priceless stone! And whoever believes in him will certainly not be disappointed.

As believers you know his great worth – indeed, his preciousness is *imparted* to you. But for those who do not believe:

The stone that the builders rejected and discarded has now become the cornerstone

and

A stone that makes them stumble and a rock to trip over.

They keep stumbling over the message because they refuse to believe it. And this they were destined to do. But you are God's chosen treasure – priests who are kings, a spiritual "nation" set apart as God's devoted ones. He called you out of darkness to experience his marvellous light, and now he claims you as his very own. He did this so that you would broadcast his glorious wonders *throughout the world*. For at one time you were not God's people, but now you are. At one time you knew nothing of God's mercy, because you hadn't received it yet, but now you are drenched with it.

Sermon 'Who Are You?

Have you ever wondered who you really are? What makes you the person that you are? I'm sure most of us have and it's interesting how people identify themselves. Think about it? If you are meeting someone new, how often do we describe ourselves by what we do, rather than who we are?

I'm someone's Mum, I'm an accountant, a teacher, a nurse, I'm at college or uni. I'm just at school. I'm unemployed. Just married. I'm homeless.

The list of descriptors is endless.

Let's talk about Jane, and there many are like her. Strikingly beautiful, willowy and elegant. Clearly very intelligent. Yet there is a fragility about her, something skittish and nervy. She admits to great loneliness and aches to find someone who will love her. One wonders how someone like her could be suffering with such low self-esteem. Why doesn't she have more confidence in herself?

She is hanging on to old memories of rejection that occurred in her teens. As she grew into adolescence her lips become full and before long other kids were teasing her cruelly, calling her rubber lips. She was the one left out at the youth club dances and the sense of shame never left her. Those childish taunts have continued to affect her sense of value long into adulthood.

Who remembers the ghastly experience of PE lessons at school? I certainly do and painfully so. The agony of waiting on the edge of the hockey field as the team captains choose their side. Knowing full well that no one would choose me as I couldn't run fast or hit a ball to save my life! Knowing that I would always be the last one left and put in goal. Skin all goose bumps and chapped with the icy wind, then punished by being the last girl again and again. And that's not to mention the hideous brown PE pants we were obliged to wear! To this day I've hated sport of all descriptions and I still haven't forgotten the pain of rejection repeating over and over, every week.

You are acceptable

Many, many studies have proven that how we see ourselves, becomes a self-fulfilling prophecy. That how we see ourselves becomes who we are.... victims become victims. Losers can become losers. Frightened people continue to live as frightened people. If we think we aren't creative then that is how it will stay. If we think we are rubbish then we behave in the same way. Just like Jane, we unintentionally set ourselves up to fail. Our beliefs about ourselves determine our behaviour.

As in Jane's case, these beliefs we have about ourselves often originate in childhood but not always. A tormented wife or husband will soon believe their tormentor is correct.

Of course so many of these beliefs are completely false. Many people have a negative view of themselves because of erroneous information they have received from misinformed and unauthorised sources in their lives.

We need to look at ourselves from a different perspective. We need to hear from someone who is informed and an authorised source, we need to listen to someone who we can count on to be truthful. God is the absolute authority on who we are. Whatever our view on evolution and the question of science, we are God's creation. He is the one we should be listening to. He gives us the correct information. When God who is the ultimate authority tells us something, then we can count on it.

1 Peter 2:9-10 Contemporary English Version (CEV)

Most of us spend much of our lives searching for acceptance. We search for it from our peers, our partners, our parents. We seek it from people we admire and those we envy or aspire to be like. Our desire for acceptance influences the clothes we wear, the company we keep, the career we choose and even the things we say.

Why are we all so driven to search for acceptance? Because it fulfils a basic human need! A rejected caveman wouldn't last long on his own if his tribe didn't accept him!

Acceptance stimulates our brains to produce endorphins, or happy hormones. It feels good. So the cycle repeats itself again. Man seeks acceptance, when accepted he is flooded with happy hormones, over and over again. When you feel accepted your self-esteem is raised.

When God says "You are God's chosen and special people "then we had better believe it! For it is only God who has the authority to tell us who we are. Whatever our failings and flaws God accepts us just as we are. Without any caveats, He invites us to play for his team. We don't need to be our best selves. He loves and accepts us just as we are. He accepts us even if we don't place much value on ourselves. It matters not a jot how rubbish our lives may be right now, how broken and lost, because we are adored and precious in the eyes of God.

You are Valuable

Looking at things from a different perspective, how much do you think you are worth? Not financially of course, but self-worth. How do we determine value?

There are 2 things that determine value in life. 1) A value depends upon how much someone is willing to pay for it and 2) value depends on who has owned that item in the past. For example, a grand piano will be more valuable if it was previously owned by Elton John!

Based on these 2 criteria, how valuable are you? The scriptures says "You were bought and paid for by Christ, so you belong to Him. God exchanged His only son for you, for us, Jesus died a cruel and barbaric death to save us. God is saying, I love you this much! Jesus paid the ultimate price for each one of us. Doesn't that tell you how priceless you are? It is a difficult concept I think, trying to comprehend the immense value Jesus places on each one of us. When in society's value system we are but a dot on a graph. When to Jesus we are the most precious treasure in the world.

You are capable

In our reading today we heard not only that we are a chosen people but indeed that we are royal priests! That's just a bit daunting when you first hear it I think! But put it this way, Peter is saying 2 things here. 1) we ordinary folk can speak directly to God just as priests do and 2) we have a responsibility to minister to the needs of other people. God is saying we are to minister or care for His people, to do His work and to tell others of the night and day difference He has made to us. We have been saved to serve others. If we are not serving, what were we saved for? Today we are talking about who we are? If you are doubting your value today, think on this. Jesus holds you in such high esteem that He is giving you His work to do.

You are forgivable

Peter goes on to say that we are forgivable "Once you received no mercy, now you have received Gods mercy". I am saying that the three words we need to know if we are to comprehend our true value are "You are forgiven". Our sins are wiped out, gone forever, treated as though they never existed. As a poster outside is saying, when we come to Christ our sins are wiped out, not rubbed in.

Let me tell you about something I heard a while ago. In Great Dunmow there is a Rolls Royce car dealership. We all know that a Rolls is incredibly expensive and a huge status symbol. Those who own one expect nothing but the best. A gentleman had owned one and had had years of perfect service but one day hit a pot-hole which snapped the rear axle. The car went into repair and the owner was surprised when he received his car back the next day, without a bill. The car had been fixed for free.....so he rang of course to see what was happening and this is the reply he received. "We have no record of your car being damaged and so there is no charge." This company's commitment to excellence would not permit a flaw to be known and so they had repaired it overnight and without charge. As if nothing had ever happened.

And so it is with God's mercy. When we confess our sin, Christ forgives us in an instant and without charge, as if nothing had ever been wrong. How highly valued does that make you feel!

Conclusion

So there we have it. The 4 pillars of self-esteem. I am acceptable. I am valuable. I am capable. I am forgivable. When we know this and when understand that the world's judgement does not matter, we know our true value. Next time you feel your sense of value dipping, remember who you are and adjust your crown, you child of God! Amen
